




Attending an Audition or Interview

For all courses, applicants need to undertake an audition/interview in person or via zoom. It is also possible to assess remotely by sending in demos. For more information contact admissions@bimm. ac.uk

Audition guidelines will be sent to the applicant along with confirmation of their booking by email.

Demo

Applicants will be sent a simple application form to complete, along with demo submission guidelines via email. This email will also confirm the date by which we will need to receive the demo audition. Upon receipt, the demo submission will be sent to an admissions lecturer for marking. A phone interview may be required before a final decision is made.

English Language Requirements

Diploma Courses

The majority of UK Visa-pending non-native English speakers applying for a Diploma course must take a UKVI secure English language test to the approved level, as set by BIMM Institute.

EU/EEA non-native English speakers

May be required to complete 'an approved English Language qualification'. The requirements differ depending on the college and course level the applicant wishes to study at. Some overseas qualifications are accepted in lieu of IELTS.

English Tests accepted by BIMM Institute

If you require a Student Visa to study at a below degree level (Diploma), you must obtain a valid Secure English Language (SELT). Please ensure you complete one of the following English tests:

- IELTS for UKVI with an overall score of 6.0 and a minimum of 5.5 in each band
- LanguageCert International ESOL SELT B2 (Listening, Reading, Writing, Speaking) Pass
- Pearson PTE Academic UKVI with a score of 50 overall, including at least 42 in all four skills

BIMM Institute can accept a range of robust English Language qualifications, these will be assessed in your application

Language CERT International ESOL* – We will accept Language Cert International ESOL at a B2 Communicator Level, when both Written (Listening, Reading, Writing) and Spoken (Speaking) tests have been completed. Students should confirm with BIMM Institute via email prior to booking this test.

*Students can obtain a £50 discount (cost payable £110), if they book this test via BIMM Institute

Deadlines and timelines to apply:

31st December 2020 – deadline for UK entry for eligibility for the scheme.

30th June 2021 – final application deadline for the EU Settlement Scheme, for those who entered the UK by the 31st December, 2020 deadline.

Those who do not apply by the deadline will effectively become undocumented and may be vulnerable to being withdrawn from their course and removed from the UK. Alternatively, they will need to obtain a UK visa under the new Points Based Immigration System, in order to study in the UK.

Moving to Germany, rights to study and visas

EU, EEA or Swiss Applicants

EU, Swiss or EEA applicants enjoy freedom of movement and can move to Germany and begin studies at BIMM Institute without the need for a visa. The only requirement is registration with the local authorities within two weeks of arrival to notify them of relocation to Germany.

Non-EU/UK Applicants

International students often need a visa to enter Germany. Non-EU applicants must apply for a Student Visa to the respective German mission (embassy) abroad before travelling.

Applying for study early, so applicants are in a position to provide a confirmation of place of study to their local German embassy, will allow completion of the visa application process with minimal delays. If study visa applications are submitted later than June, administrative delays could be experienced, which could impact planned September study.

Working During Studies

Students from the European Union, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland have unrestricted access to the German labour market and have practically the same rights as German students. However, if they work more than 20 hours per week, or dependant on the rate of pay for work completed, they must pay certain insurance and tax contributions just like German students.

Non-EU students can also complete paid work during their studies – up to 120 full days or 240 half days per year. Generally, this equates to 20 hours per week during each 30-week semester. Non-EU students may be able to increase this to full-time work during holiday periods/semester breaks but will need to request a work permit from the Federal Employment Agency and Foreigners' Authority.

This work permit would have details on the number of hours of work the student can complete, and tax and insurance contributions would be based on the hours of work and salary.



Non-EU applicants studying on the BA (Hons) in Commercial Modern Music course can seek full-time visa support from our validating partners TU Dublin, with further information available at tudublin.ie/study/international-students.

It is not currently possible to secure a full-time Student Visa for the BA (Hons) Music Business course at BIMM Institute Dublin. This is because the award is validated by BIMM Institute, a UK awarding Institute, rather than an Irish body. We recommend all Non-EU students investigate their individual visa requirements for study in Ireland directly at www.inis.gov.ie/en/INIS/Pages/check-irish-visa

Working During Studies

Students from the European Union, Iceland, UK, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland have unrestricted access to the Irish labour market and have practically the same rights as Irish students. However, if they work more than 20 hours per week, or dependant on the rate of pay for work completed, they must pay certain insurance and tax contributions just like Irish students.

Non-EU students with student visas on the BA (Hons) in Commercial Modern Music course can also complete paid work during their studies.

Generally, this equates to 20 hours per week during each academic term.

Non-EU students studying on the BA (Hons) Music Business course should investigate their visa requirements directly at inis.gov.ie

Commission Claim/Payment Process

Agents must notify BIMM Institute of each application they submit by emailing alansharman@bimm.ac.uk as soon as the student's application is submitted.

Step 1: Please wait until you're certain of all the students you're going to claim for. For students starting in September/October of a given year, claims will need to be submitted by 30th November.

Step 2: Invoices must be submitted on a fully completed pro forma invoice and emailed to alansharman@bimm.ac.uk On verification, we'll confirm the list of students you're eligible to claim for

Step 3: Once we confirm that the students fees have been paid in full, we will process the commission payment within 30 days.

Please note

- (a) Commission claims sent before the students have enrolled will not be checked until after the start of term.
- (b) Commission is only payable when the required tuition fees have been paid in full. Please ensure your agent/company bank details are included on the invoice.

Q: What happens if two or more agents claim commission for the same student?

A: The name of the agent whose agency name is on the student's application form is considered the agent for the purpose of commission.

B: If the student's application does not reference any agent, the agent who submits confirmation by email to BIMM Institute first is considered the student's agent for the purpose of commission.
